Write me a paper on some aspect of food. This is a “made up” paper using the following made up sources. The ONLY thing I am looking at is how you put the paper together – the APA mechanics. Here is what is required:

1. APA Style Title page
2. introduction (thesis statement; preview statement)
3. Include the following in your paper:
 - a. _____running head
 - b. _____ _____ two different beginning sentence cites
 - c. _____ _____ two different end of sentence cites
 - d. _____ _____ _____ one multiple author cite used at least three times
4. EACH of the five listed sources needs to be used at least once. It’s up to you to decide in which format you’d like to use them. Each of the above types of cites need to be used...you can count each type of cite (e.g., end of sentence, beginning, etc.) only once (even though you can reuse the cites numerous times). So you will have a TOTAL of 7 citations (each source below possibly used more than once) in this assignment.
5. A separate reference page made up of the following sources:
 - a) An article in the research journal *Food in America* by Monica Deming and Jessica L. Barrett. This article was titled “Eating Good Things” and was in volume 5 of the 1992 journal. The article was found on pages 55-67.
 - b) A chapter in an edited book was written by Bob Barker and Jacob Eckstein and Aaron D. Brule. The chapter was called “Making Food on a Stove.” The book was called “Christmas Secrets” and was edited by Jodi Larson and Cleopatra Snuggles and found on pages 88-98. The company that published it was Tree Company found in Sioux Falls South Dakota. The book was published in its 2nd edition in 1988.
 - c) Pat Sajak, Vanna P. White, David A. Kazibut, Ellie May Klampett, and Barack Obama wrote an article for an internet-only journal. The article was titled “How to Eat and then Vomit it All Up.” The article was written in 2000. The article was pulled on November 18, 2002, and found on <http://www.journalsforfun.com> . This was the fifth volume and third issue of the Journal of Food in My Tummy.
 - d) Sexy Sassafrass wrote an article called “The End of Food as We Know It: Counting Calories” This was in the 1998, Journal of Basting in Issue 2, Volume 4 on pages 23-27.
 - e) Lolita Daniels wrote an article in 2006 in the Journal of Unique Women titled “Making Our Own Way: Tales of Lost Cooking” in volume 8 and pages 77-81.
